This year is a special year for the Nemaha County STEP Foundation as the community foundation is celebrating its 30th anniversary and third Match Day. Match Day is simply a dedicated day of giving. The STEP Foundation has 29 funds available to receive donations on Friday, August 25, 2023. Each fund may receive up to \$4,000 in matching funds. In order to provide a pool of funding, there are STEP-Up Supporters. These are businesses, families, couples, and individuals who give \$500 to the General Fund and \$500 to the pooled fund. If you would like to become a STEP-Up Supporter, please contact STEP Executive Director Tory Jost.

A special opportunity for this year is the Matching Grant available thanks to the generosity of the Patterson Family Foundation. STEP has been selected as a grant recipient which means if STEP raises \$70,000 on Match Day, then the Patterson Family Foundation will match \$70,000. If STEP raises less than \$70,000, STEP receives matching dollars for each dollar raised. For example, if STEP raises \$50,000, then the Patterson Family Foundation matches \$50,000. What an incredible grant opportunity! Therefore, the goal this year is to raise at least \$70,000 on Match Day.
